1. International Day of Prayer


SUNDAY, 13 Nov 2011 is designated as the International Day of Prayer (IDOP) for the persecuted church worldwide. This global event remembers Christians around the world who suffer for their faith. They face beatings, imprisonment, discrimination and even death. This day is set apart for us to remember these brothers and sisters, simply because they profess Jesus Christ as Lord. 3. Around The World

Libya •



With the fall of Sirte and the death of Gaddafi, Libva was finally declared 'liberated' by the National Transitional Council. With that announcement, the motion is set for an interim government to be formed and the first elections to be held within eight months. The new government will need to restore order and forge unity among the rebels as well as revive the economy. Pray for unity and reconciliation in Libya. Pray for the reconstruction



of their infrastructure and restoration of their economy. Pray for a democratic government and a constitution that will safeguard religious freedom for the minority religious groups.

Thailand =



Bangkok is facing her worst flood since 1942. While central Bangkok is unaffected, areas north, east and west of the city as well as the central province of Thailand remain underwater. The death toll currently stands at 365 persons. Over 113,000 displaced persons have been moved to various temporal shelters. The floods are expected to incur over US6 billion in economic cost and currently 700,000 persons are out of work. According to forecasts, the flood waters are expected to recede within six weeks to manageable levels. Pray for the

flood waters to recede soon. Pray for food and medical aid to reach all the affected areas. Pray for Bangkok's full recovery from this flood.

Turkey C*

A 7.2 earthquake has struck Eastern Turkey, making it the most powerful earthquake to hit the country in ten years. Tens of thousands fled into the streets running, screaming or trying to reach relatives on cell phones as apartment and office buildings cracked or collapsed. As the full extent of the damage became clear, survivors dug in with shovels or even their bare hands, desperately trying to rescue the trapped and the injured. The hardest hit area was Ercis, an eastern city of 75,000 close to the Iranian border.



which lies on one of Turkey's most earthquake-prone zones. Sources say 272 have been confirmed killed and more than 1,300 injured, but officials estimate that the death toll could rise further as a result of low housing standards in the area and the size of the quake. Some 2,400 rescue workers, 680 medics, 12 rescue dogs, 108 ambulances and seven air ambulances are involved in the relief effort. Since the quake struck, tens of thousands have been sleeping outside in freezing conditions. Pray for more survivors to be pulled out of the rubble. Pray for urgent medical aid, food and shelter to reach the thousands that are injured and left homeless. Pray for God's comfort upon the survivors who have lost their loved ones, home and livelihood.
