DAY 1 FRIDAY 22 JUNE 2012

P1 Plenary 1 : Leadership Promise (Peter Chao)

Leadership is a relationship between those who aspire to lead and those who choose to follow. The strength of that relationship will determine if the leader is effective, if the followers are motivated, and if the collective vision is realized. When promises are made, hope is engendered. When promises are kept, trust is fostered. What are the promises a leader needs to make to ensure goals will be met, followers will be inspired, and the Lord will be glorified?

W1 Workshop 1 : Leading for the Long Haul (Peter Chao)

A leader is not only concerned with the present but also builds for the future. The finish is perhaps more important than the start. This workshop looks at ways in which a leader can draw resource and inspiration from their spiritual, intellectual and emotional hinterlands which will then enable them to lead for the long haul.

W2 Workshop 2 : Spiritual Transformation (Kow Shih Ming)

Spiritual transformation of our community and organization begins with the transformation of leaders. But how does one experience spiritual transformation and grow in spiritual vitality amidst the hectic demands of life in the family, the marketplace, and the church? What are the challenges to spiritual vitality? What are the elements essential for spiritual growth? Learn how to transform your world by becoming the spiritual leader your organization is looking for.

W3 Workshop 3 : Toxic Leadership (Michael Tan)

According to management guru Peter Drucker, the spirit of an organization is created at the top. Toxic leadership leads to toxic ministry or organization. Many leaders may not be aware of the dysfunctions that drive them. What are the evidences of toxic leadership? Discover the various types of leadership toxicity. How do we prevent toxicity?

P2 Plenary 2 : Leading from Within (Michael Tan)

Leadership is not just about performance and achievement. Leaders are themselves flawed and imperfect people. Yet moral leadership is what followers expect from their leaders. How do we lead from within? Christian leadership is a spiritual practice not a technique. This plenary looks at the essential aspects of leadership as a spiritual practice.

Mr Peter Chao is the Founder-President of Eagles Communications. His often trenchant observations on the pains and aspirations of human life make him an effective motivational speaker. Besides leading Eagles, he also sits on the Board of Trustees of Fuller Theological Seminary, USA. Peter has done his postgraduate work in leadership at the Peter F Drucker and Masatoshi Ito Graduate School of Management, Claremont Graduate University, USA.



Dr John Ng is the President of Meta, providing consultation services to top international corporations. He also serves as the Honorary Chair of the Eagles Communications Board of Governance and directs the leadership programs of the organization as Chair of the Eagles Leadership Institute. He is additionally the Honorary Chair of Eagles Mediation and Counseling Centre (EMCC) Board of Governance. Well versed in the art of motivation and management, he is a well sought after speaker. John has a Ph.D. in Interpersonal Communication from Northwestern University, USA.



Mr Michael Tan is the Executive Vice-President at Eagles Communications. His portfolio includes overseeing human resource, corporate communications, ministry programs, and managing Eagles VantagePoint, a bi-monthly magazine addressing issues related to church and the marketplace. He is a well-received speaker on various life and leadership development topics. Michael has a B.A.(Hons) in Theology from the London School of Theology, UK and a M.Th. from Trinity Theological College, Singapore.



Rev Dr Kow Shih Ming is Pastor-in-Charge of Faith Methodist Church and District Superintendent (East) in the Trinity Annual Conference, Singapore. In ministry since 1992, Shih Ming has a deep passion for equipping church leaders to make a significant kingdom difference in our

world. He has been involved in training pastors both locally and in the region, including Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, Philippines, Vietnam, Thailand and Nepal. Before entering the pastoral ministry, Shih Ming was an electronics engineer in a multi-national company.



Ps Dr Chew Weng Chee is the Senior Pastor of SIB (KL), a rapidly growing English congregation in Malaysia. He was a Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist before he gave up his medical career to serve the Lord full time in 1999. He graduated with a Masters degree in Theology from the Regent College Bible School, Vancouver in 1993. Till March 2007, he was the President of the SIB (Sidang Injil Borneo), Semenanjung, overseeing 31 Bahasa Malaysia churches throughout West Malaysia. Ps Chew has ministered extensively in Conferences and Church Camps both locally and overseas and has written a book entitled, "Is Life Worth Living?" a study on the Book of Ecclesiastes.



Ms Bonita Lim is a fashion designer and philanthropist. Starting 2001, Bonita bought her first sewing machine, hired a sewer to teach her the basics to garment making, and researched the garment and fashion industry extensively. By 2004, Bonita was making children dresses and sold them at flea markets in Shanghai. By 2006, Brown Rice Design & Consulting was incorporated, with the mission to provide sustainable livelihood for underprivileged women and children, using branding, marketing, and design to maximize the margins for their labor. By 2008, the first NuoMi store opened. By 2010, NuoMi has 4 stores in Shanghai. With projected annual revenue of 3.7 million RMB ending 2011, Brown Rice has 30 fulltime employees, and 4 livelihood families. Bonita received a B.A. in Philosophy from the University of Toronto, and an MBA in New Venture Development from the University of Calgary.

W4 Workshop 4 : Transforming Self to Lead (Bonita Lim)

Change is part of a leader's growth and development - change in attitude, styles, perspectives, etc. Self awareness is important for it leads to a personal transformation. What does it take to begin to transform oneself? What self disciplines must we maintain to be able to lead effectively?

W5 Workshop 5 : Leadership Burnout (Chew Weng Chee)

Leaders are not superhuman. They are susceptible to burnout, a term use to describe a syndrome of emotional exhaustion. How can we identify these symptoms in a burnout leader. The cost of burnout can be high, both for the leader, his work and those who are involved in his life. How then can one recover from such a situation? What steps can be taken by the victim and his community of faith to restore the leader to his total health?

W6 Workshop 6 : Emotionally Healthy Leader (John Ng)

It is impossible to be spiritually mature while remaining emotionally immature. This workshop will address the problem of emotionally unhealthy spirituality and provide practical skills and tools for developing a model that will result in deep transformation in the leader's life and organizations.

P3 Plenary 3 : Character: Does it Matter? (John Ng)

A leader's competence can get him to the top. But his character will determine if he succeeds or fails in leading others to follow him in the long run. Will he be a leader worth following? Will he be able to inspire good character and values in his team? This plenary examines what leadership character is all about.
