Training Module Offered

IDRN 1100 - Community Based Disaster Preparedness

The Community Based Disaster Preparedness course is designed to teach individuals and families the necessary steps to prepare for a disaster and how to survive a disaster. The course provides a step-bystep approach to disaster preparedness by walking the trainee through identifying their local hazards, developing and maintaining an emergency communications plan, and developing a disaster supplies kit. It also covers topics such as evacuation, shelter, go-bags, and disaster survival.

IDRN 1300 - Community Based Disaster Response

IDRN 1300 - Community Based Disaster Response - is intended to foster robust and resilient communities in the face of a disaster. The IDRN 1300 is the follow up course to IDRN 1100. This course is designed to equip trainees with the knowledge and skills needed to respond to a disaster within their community.

Through the training, trainees are provided with the skills and information necessary to be selfsustainable during a disaster. Participants will gain a basic understanding of coordinating multiple teams in a disaster zone, while simultaneously collaborating with larger NGOs and other international entities. Trainees will obtain skills in conducting timely and accurate needs and damage assessments, as well as basic disaster response skills such as: fire suppression, urban search and rescue, surface water rescue, and medical triage. In addition, techniques for acquiring bulk relief supplies as well as establishing a distribution network will be covered.

IDRN Badges

Once trained, IDRN members will receive an IDRN badge. This badge indicates the level of training the member has received. In addition, this badge has also allowed members to gain access through checkpoints, and has granted access into meetings.
